

2. Visa information

Before arriving in Taiwan

For overseas Chinese students and nationals of other countries

After arriving in Taiwan, extending your visa:

Visitor visa extension

Visitor visa holders can apply for extension up to **15 days** before expiry.

Documents required:

- Application form
- Passport with visitor visa
- Proof of study/attendance
- No fee required

Resident visa extension

Resident visa holders are required to apply for <u>Alien Resident Certificate</u> (ARC).

Documents required:

- Application form
- Passport with resident visa
- Admission letter
- Proof of study/attendance
- Fee: 1,000 NTD

Apply at **Local National Immigration Agency**

Please note:

Overseas Chinese students and nationals of other countries holding **VISITOR VISA** are not permitted to reside in Taiwan. Those intending to study and reside in Taiwan **MUST** obtain a **RESIDENT VISA**. If necessary, you can convert your visa while in Taiwan.

Transportation

1. How to get to DA Yeh university:

Route 1:



- Take the Taoyuan Bus 5059 (桃園客運) or UBus 706 (統聯客運) from Taoyuan Airport to Taoyuan Railway Station.
- Once you arrive at the destination, please transfer to Taiwan Railways for Yuanlin Station.
- Then you can take **Yuanlin Bus 6700 (**員林客運**)** or **Changhua Bus 6914 (**彰 **化客運)** and get off at **DA Yeh University (**大葉大學**) stop**.

Route 2:



- Take the Taoyuan Metro from Taoyuan Airport(A12/A13) to Taoyuan HSR station(A18).
- Take the High Speed Rail from Taoyuan Station to Taichung Station.
- Then you can take Taxi to DA YEH University (大葉大學).

Route 3:



- Take the Taoyuan Metro from Taoyuan Airport(A12/A13) to Taoyuan HSR station(A18).
- Take the High Speed Rail from Taoyuan Station to **Taichung Station**.
- At Taichung HSR Station, following the instruction and transfer to Xinwuri(新鳥日) Train Station by walking around 3 minutes.
- Take the train from Xinwuri Station to **Yuanlin Station**.
- Once you arrive at Yuanlin Station, you can take Yuanlin Bus 6700 (員林客運) or Changhua Bus 6914 (彰化客運) and get off at DA Yeh University (大葉大學) stop.







Enrolment

Registration Procedure:

- 1. Collect an enrolment process form:
 - Go to the administration office for the department where you will be studying and confirm your personal details.
 - Pick up an enrolment form and student information pack.
 - Hand in your student background form, plus a photocopy of your passport.
- 2. Return enrolment form to enrolment office:
 - Go to the enrolment office (A108) in Administration Building and submit your completed enrolment form.
 - Submit 3 photos with your name and your department on the back. This
 is for your ID card.
 - You must finish the enrolment procedure by the end of the first week of each semester.

Please provide the following documents:

- 1 1. 1 photocopy of your certificate of formal education, verified by the R.O.C. embassy in your country.
 - 2. **1 photocopy** of your academic transcript, verified by the R.O.C. embassy in your country.
 - 3. An English authorization letter that authorizes the university to examine your formal educational records.
 - 4. 2 photocopies of your passport
 - 5. **2 photocopies of your Alien Resident Certificate (A.R.C.)**



Information for MA & Ph. D.

Studying and researching towards completion of a postgraduate degree is a crucial part of building towards your dream career.

This page contains all the information you need to help make your postgraduate studies a success at DA YEH.

Step1- Choosing a course: For 1those studying in a new discipline, different their prior field of studies, students must take a basic course in their new field.



Step2- Apply for a supervisor: Once a course has been chosen, the first step is to apply for a su- pervisor. You must find a professor in your department who is a good match for your area of interest. Then, together with the help of your supervisor, you may decide your research subject.



Step3- Proposal defense: Many departments require MA and Ph.D. candidates to submit an oral defense of their research project for every chapter they com- plete. This will be in the 1st, 2nd and 3rd years of your degree.



Step4- Final defense: This is the final examination for your degree. Every student wishing to complete their degree must defend their thesis with an oral test in front of their supervisor and a panel from the department.



Step5- Thesis review: Once the defense of your thesis is complete, the full finished manuscript must be submitted to the online submission system. Your thesis will be checked for plagiarism, and then confirmed.

One of the greatest opportunities you have as an international student studying away from home is the chance to learn a new language! In fact, learning some basic words and phrases in Chinese is one of the best ways to help introduce you to your new environment and make new friends. Below are some words to help you get started. But re- member! There is an entire language and culture to explore while you are here in Taiwan, so be sure to make the most of it!

Bank Account

International students living in Taiwan and holding an Alien Resident Certificate (ARC) are eligible to open a bank account. The most convenient account for students is the Individual Account operated by the Post Office.

Required documents:

- 1. Passport
- 2. ARC
- 3. Personal Seal (Chinese or English)

Work permit and part-time work

To apply for a work permit, go to the Workforce Development Agency in person, or send the required documents by mail.

Healthcare and Hospitals

1. Medical check

All international students must provide a medical certificate obtained in their country of origin, showing proof of vaccination and the absence of serious illness. This can be the same medical certificate used to obtain your visa from the Taiwan immigration office.

2. Health Insurance

There are three options for health insurance available:

☐ International Travel Insurance:

Students may purchase their own insurance in their country of origin, to cover their entire stay in Taiwan.

☐ Student Group Insurance:

DA YEH University operates student group insurance, covering hospitalization, outpatient services, operations, accidents and emergency illnesses. (NTD 500 per month.)

■ National Health Insurance (NHI):

Once students have lived in Taiwan continuously for more than 6 months, they are eligible to join the NHI plan. You will be issued a health card that allows access to NHI services for after paying a registration fee.


2. Taichung National Museum of Natural Science

3. Feng Chia Nightmarket



Rules for student dorm conduct

DA YEH University Student Dormitory Convention and Penalty Regulations

- 1. To maintain a safe and peaceful dormitory environment, offenses will be met with penalty points, dormitory expelling or punishment under school regulations for the more severe. Stdents who receive more than (including) 10 points and do not offset the record in a given time will only be able to stay until the end of the semester, and will not be qualified for further accommodation at the dormitory in the following school year. Having received 15 points, students will be expelled without refunds and will be required to move out within two weeks. In addition, they will not be qualified for further accommodation at the dormitory in the following school year.
- 2. The regulations apply to all students, including exchange and international students. Students who do not live in the school dormitories will be handled by the Life Guidance Section as regulated by school rules. Regulatory enforcement units include dorm counselors and dorm cadre members. The first two weeks of every semester are the grace period (not applicable to regulation 1~2 of article 5). In the grace period, verbal warnings will be given when rules are violated. After the grace period, offenses will be met with penalty points.
- 3. Penalty points must be offset within 2 weeks (not applicable to regulation 1~2 of article 5) to continue the stay. The priority of dormitory drawing sequence in the following school year will be subject to the total penalty points (after being offset).
- 4. Severe offenses will be met with criminal sanctions and civil compensations.

5. Dormitory penalty points are listed as follows:

01	Bringing visitors, non-dormitory residents or people of opposite sex for overnight stay; girls lingering in the male dormitory; boys lingering in the female dormitory	expel
02	Drinking, gambling, fighting, smoking, mahjong, theft, consumption of betel nuts, drugs and other misconduct impairing the dormitory safety	expel
03	Privately accessing the power line	-10
04	Changing rooms without permission.	-10
05	Cooking, burning, barbequing, setting off fireworks and storing prohibited items (In addition to giving a penalty point, the security staff will confiscate the prohibited items.)	-10
06	Being unable to get along well with roommates (The Life Guidance Section will arrange the changing of rooms when conflicts happen for the first time. If similar events continue, penalty points will be given under the overall appeal of the other roommates and official verification.)	-10
07	Caressing, dawdling, kissing or conducting relevant misbehavior in the student lounge	-10
08	Keeping pets (including marine animals) in the dormitory	-10
09	Climbing walls, fences or windows	-10
10	Sabotaging locks or other access equipment (being liable to repair costs and handled with school regulations)	-10
11	Depriving others of studying or sleep, rallying outside visitors or gathering for business/religious purposes	-10
12	Altering dormitory equipment; damaging or losing public properties, including room keys (being liable to full expenses and receiving penalty points)	-10
13	Playing ball sports or deliberately making noises; disturbing roommates by using the clothes dryer, the hair dryer and the washing machine after 12a.m.	-10
14	Using prohibited electronics other than hairdryers, fans, shavers, computers and other approved electronics (In addition to penalty points, prohibited electronics will be confiscated.)	-10
15	Parking bicycles or motorcycles in the dormitory corridors, student lounges or public areas	-10
16	Ignoring the verbal warnings given by dorm counselors or dorm cadre members; being rude towards authorized personnel	-10
17	Hogging dorm rooms or denying roommates access; inviting family or friends in without roommates' approval	-10
18	Altering dorm positions without authorized approval	-5
19	If room lights are on after 11p.m. with no one inside, 5 penalty points will be given to each resident.	-5
	During or 1 week before the midterm and final test week, there are no restrictions.	
20	Placing garbage in the corridors, student lounges and other public areas; disregarding public environment and hygiene. If culprit is unknown, the video footage will be released to find the culprit. If the residents' garbage is found placed outside the dorm rooms, each resident in the same dorm will receive 5 penalty points.	-5
21	Randomly opening screens to litter or letting mosquitoes and bugs in	-5
22	Failing to do garbage recycling; placing garbage in the wrong place	-5
23	Failing to park cars, motorcycles or bicycles at designated area and obstructing traffic. In addition to penalty points, the misconduct will be reported to the Division of Life Guidance and Section of Environment Management.	-5
24	Unhygienic behavior reported by roommates	-5
25	Placing or hanging private items in public areas	-5

- 6. Intentionally or repetitively violating the same regulations will lead to one to three times of penalty points. The dormitory cadre members will make the decision on the penalty points and re- quest approval from the Life Guidance Section.
- 7. Unscheduled safety checks will be held by dorm cadre members every semester. Offenders of the regulations will be dealt with according to school regulations.
- 8. Dorm cadre members who cannot meet the job requirements (implementing dormitory checks) will be dismissed.
- 9. Dorm cadre members who violate the regulations will be given penalty points and considered to be dismissed by the dormitory assistance counsel.
- 10. Authorized personnel have the right to enter dorm rooms for dormitory checks even when the resident is present.
- 11. Penalty points will be counted until 12 a.m. the night before the drawing of dormitory acceptance for the 2nd semester; the penalty points record will affect the priority of dormitory drawing sequence.
- 12. The cadre members will check the hygiene of the dorm rooms at the end of the stay. If the room is in a good condition, the deposit NT 1,000 will be returned without interest. If the dormitory is in a messy condition, NT 300 will be deducted from the deposit for cleaning fees. If the dorm room is found unhygienic or in a messy condition by the dorm cadre members or the authorized personnel (when the last resident leaves the room), NT 300 will be deducted from each resident's deposit to cover the cleaning fees.
- 13. Damaged or missing public property will have to be paid in full price by all the residents' depos- it; damaged or missing personal items will be paid by the user's deposit. If there are insufficient funds in the deposit, parents will be contacted for payment.
- 14. Failure to move out of the dormitory before the deadline will result in deduction from residents' deposit (NT 100/day). The more severe offenders will be expelled, and their parents will be informed.
